I wish to register my disappointment with the ambitious targets under table 3.2 for County Mayo generally 2016 - 2026 - 2031.

This increase in population is insufficient, in my opinion, to ensure a strong vibrant population particularly outside the Limerick, Shannon Erne axis.

Rural areas, small towns & villages need greater room for development and population increase than that allowed for in the projections.

Our County Development Plan must reflect greater support for these areas with the ambition that the need for housing & work by so many people to return to live in County Mayo post pandemic will result in an increase in the population projections from the National Development Plan during the life time of the County Development Plan.

37 units = 63 people and Pil Fenaras 13 units

Ballyvaughan with 15 units & 29 people will, as other  
villages are, be skewed to the numbers needed to regenerate,

I seek a relaxation of the rules reflected in CDP 4.14 New Single Houses in the County side particularly restrictions around ~~Heritage~~ Site abutting Scenic Routes.

My area, North More, is a tourist hot spot which is most welcome.

However the restrictions around planning on sites adjacent to scenic routes is causing hardship for those who own the property along these routes and who fairly wish to build a house & live on these lands.

Considerations around Heritage Landscapes and raw proximity to scenic routes makes it ~~high~~ very more difficult to fit planning which is leading to a decline of the population in these areas with the consequent reduction in school going pupils, supportive rural communities and an overall reduction in the population in large swathes of North & West Cumbria.

My Observation on CPD 4.14 Economic Need -

This section seeks to suggest that only those who have an economic & social need should reside in Rural close. This seeks to restrict those who will qualify - further reduce the population of Rural close.

The presumption that one does not qualify until one can prove otherwise is a detrimental step and will cause hardship for renters & farm families and those who, by choice, wish to reside in a rural area.

The 10 Hectare Rule must be seen as a yardstick to confirm qualification while the absence of 10 Hectares must not be seen as a yardstick for refusal of permission. Likewise 10 years residency in an area is a very high bar to reach, too high in my opinion and should be much lower.
