The use of the following chemicals as a processing agent shall not be permitted as part of any proposed processing operation located above or adjacent to surface or ground waters, or which could potentially impact such waters regardless of their location- mercury, cyanide or cyanide compounds, breakdown products of cyanide, or sulfuric acid, These present an unreasonable risk of environmental harm due to the

toxicity of such chemicals and their demonstrated potential to damage to the environment

Please make county Clare the second county to regulate the use of cyanide, cyanide compounds, breakdown products of cyanide, mercury and sulfuric acid. And lead the way to a nationwide ban, to show that Ireland is open for the business of clean water, healthy soil, safe air and a sustainable future for the next generations.
